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Application Questions

What does this show you about your own heart? In light of this, how would this affect your prayer life? Bring this to prayer.

2. Even as saved sinners, we still waffle and fail in our walks with Jesus. The destination is sure. But along the way, we stumble. Like Peter, how have you stumbled? What did it do to you and in you? How should your own frailty of heart affect the way you treat others or seek to reach them for Christ? Use what God has taken you through to minister to another Christian or encourage a struggling unbeliever to trust Christ.

3. Read Romans 8:31-39. Reflect on it. What does the passage tell you about God and also about how God see you if you are his? Write this in a journal and pray.

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
